July/Aug 1989 - correspondence with Mrs M.C. Garlike with photocopies of the schoolchildren taken outside the old police house in 1935

3/2/1989 - letter from David Peerman with family tree of David & Sarah Beckett

Apr/May 1989 - correspondence with Eunice Sewel, widow of John Sewell, re photographs of incumbents

Marriages - 1813 to 1908, typed list, Ackland to Luke only (3 pages)

PHOTOGRAPHS:

Note that these photographs appear to have been numbered in the order in which they were found in the original John Jenkyns collection folder, but this has no apparent structure and the photos seem to have been somewhat jumbled up. The photos have been subsequently grouped as follows:

Highlighted in yellow: very old photos from c1880.

Highlighted in red: dedication of the bells 1933

Highlighted in green: sundry original historic photos from before c 1960

Highlighted in blue: [still to be processed]

1990s photos [still to be identified/ processed]

Where the photos are (inferior) copies of photos already in the WOTP archives this is indicated below

More work still to be done to group the photos

Note that the dates given for these photos by TH were initial estimates which were subsequently revised. For further information see 'Notes on the John Jenkyns Collection of Papers and Photographs By Patrick Symington'¹.
